1. Please describe the specific **locations & villages** to receive nets and the number to each? Please provide longitude/latitude information. (Important note: If the distribution is approved, approval will be for the nets to be distribution to these specific locations. Location changes will only be considered, and may be refused, if due to exceptional/unforeseen circumstances.)

The nets will be distributed to 2 locations although the locations are connected.

1. Kiro Kabowa

The first distribution of 52 nets in April 2008 was to the children who resided at the Centre, a mixture of orphans & vulnerable children who could not live at home. This second distribution of 80 nets is for the children who attend the centre but live at home in Kiro Kabowa one of the slum areas in Kampala.

2. Ndeeba

Linked to the Kiro Kabowa Centre is another school in the nearby slum area of Ndeeba. The ACDT is providing chiropractic care to both schools & the schools have the same director who set the schools up. There are 400 children that attend this school who live at home, in very poor conditions & the remaining nets are for the 20 teachers at the school.

2. Is this an **urban or rural** area and how many people live in this specific area?

Both areas are in the urban area of Kampala, on the outskirts of the city centre. I do not know the exact figures of the population of that area but I believe it to be a few thousand.

3. Is this a **high risk malaria area**? If yes, why do you designate it as high?

This is a high risk area not just because of Uganda being a high risk country but because of the locations of the schools & the conditions these children live in. The homes are in very poor condition. There is no drainage & very poor sanitation. The area is prone to substantial flooding.

4. How many reported cases of malaria and malaria deaths were there in this area in 2005? If you do not have statistics please make a qualitative comment.

I do not have exact figures but the director of the school reports at least 4 cases of malaria amongst these children every week.

5. Is this distribution of nets 'blanket coverage' of an area/village or to a select/vulnerable group? If the latter, please describe this group.

A select vulnerable group of children who live in 2 of the slum areas of Kampala, Kiro Kabowa & Ndeeba.

6. What is the existing level of ITN use in this area? Are there existing bednet distribution programmes in this area?

There is no net distribution in operation in this area. The distribution in Apr08 was the first of its kind in this area.

7. Why was the area/villages chosen for bednet distribution and who made this decision? Please provide the name, position and organisation of the person/s making the decision.

The decision was made by myself, Dr Nikki Collinson based on the work done with these children through the Africa Childrens Development Trust.

8. Have you consulted with the National Malaria Programme in your country about this distribution and what was their response? Please provide the name, position and contact details of the person/s with whom you have liaised.

I have not consulted with them but I aim to become in contact with them In Spet/Oct 08 to make them aware of the distribution we are carrying out.

The distribution numbers have been based around the current work being completed by the ACDT.

The nets will be distributed by myself Dr Nikki Collinson. We will be educating the children & their parents on the use of these nets & providing them with hooks & string as necessary. We endeavour to get each child involved in this distribution.

11. What post-distribution follow-up is planned to assess the level of usage (hang-up percentage) of the nets? How long after the distribution will this assessment take place? Will you provide us with the findings? What will you be able to do subsequently to increase net hang-up if relevant?

We will be spot checking a number of homes at the end of October 2008 to confirm that the nets are in full use & have

been hung correctly. We will be able to provide you with this information.
